His narrative reveals a school deliberately repositioning itself to meet the demands of a changing education landscape while remaining rooted in strong values and community engagement.**”**

Agoro Sare National School has, over the last four years, steadily emerged as one of the most transformative public secondary schools in the region, driven by a deliberate focus on quality education, holistic student development,

innovation and strong community partnerships. At the centre of this transformation is Chief Principal Dr. Isaac Okeyo Ogol, whose academic background, leadership philosophy and inclusive approach have reshaped the school's academic trajectory and institutional culture.

Speaking during an in-depth interview with ACTT media, Principal Ogol reflected on his personal journey, professional career and the milestones Agoro Sare High School has achieved since he assumed leadership of the institution. His narrative reveals a school deliberately repositioning itself to

meet the demands of a changing education landscape while remaining rooted in strong values and community engagement.

Dr. Ogol's Journey is Rooted in Education and Leadership

Principal Ogol began his education in a local primary school in his village before proceeding to Mbita High School for his Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education examinations. His passion for teaching and learning led him to Kenyatta University, where he pursued a Bachelor's degree in Education (Science).

Determined to strengthen both his academic and leadership credentials, he later enrolled at Maseno University, where he earned a Master's degree in Applied Mathematics. He subsequently pursued a second Master's degree in Education Management and Leadership at Mount Kenya University before completing a PhD in Education Management and Leadership at the same institution. In addition, he holds a diploma in Education Management and Leadership from KEMI, which further enhanced his administrative capacity.

His professional career began at Sawagongo High School in Siaya County, where he served for eight years. He was later promoted to Deputy Principal at Maseno School, serving for seven years, before being appointed Principal at Itirio Boys High School, where he led for five years. He later worked at Kodero Bara Secondary School for two years before being transferred to Agoro Sare High School, where he is now serving his fourth year as Chief Principal.

Setting Priorities: Quality Education and Holistic Growth

Upon assuming leadership at Agoro Sare National School, Principal Ogol identified quality education and learning as his foremost priority. Working closely with teachers, the Board of Management, parents and the wider community, he embarked on a deliberate strategy to improve academic performance while



nurturing students holistically. He emphasized that learning must go beyond examination performance, noting that students who are exposed to sports, arts and leadership opportunities often demonstrate improved discipline, confidence and academic focus. As a result, the school places equal emphasis on classroom instruction and out-of-class activities.

Investing in Talent, Sports and Leadership



Agoro Sare High School has become a hub for talent development, with students excelling in sports, music, drama and leadership forums. The school's brass band has earned national recognition and regularly participates in regional and East African events. Students also compete successfully in music and drama festivals, while sports teams continue to perform strongly at various levels. Leadership training is deliberately embedded in school life, with the administration believing that every learner should leave the institution equipped to lead and serve society responsibly. According to Principal Ogol, holistic development is not optional but essential in preparing students for life beyond school.





Supporting Teachers and Inclusive School Culture

Beyond students, the school administration has invested heavily in the professional development of teachers and non-teaching staff. Principal Ogol noted that an inclusive environment, where every staff member feels valued and supported, is critical to institutional success. Creativity and innovation are encouraged, particularly through the integration of digital learning into instructional delivery. Teachers are supported to adapt to modern teaching methodologies that align with the needs of the 21st-century learner.

Navigating Modern Challenges in Education

Despite the progress made, Agoro Sare National School continues to face contemporary challenges common across the education sector. Mental health issues among students and teachers have become more pronounced, prompting the school to strengthen its Guidance and Counseling Department.

Teacher burnout, caused by heavy workloads, large class sizes and the complexities of managing modern learners, has also emerged as a key concern. Principal Ogol observed that traditional approaches to teaching are no longer sufficient, emphasizing the need for flexibility, empathy and continuous professional growth.

Infrastructure Growth to Match Rising Enrolment

One of the most visible indicators of transformation at Agoro Sare High School has been rapid infrastructure development. Since Principal Ogol's arrival, the school

has invested heavily in improving facilities to create a conducive learning environment and accommodate growing student numbers. The school has constructed a modern main gate, built teachers' houses to provide on-campus accommodation, installed LPG systems, expanded laboratory facilities, added classrooms and administrative offices, fully cabled the compound and increased ICT equipment. Significant investment has also been made in facilities supporting co-curricular activities, including sports and music.



A new basketball pitch has been completed, while construction of a modern multipurpose hall capable of accommodating 3,000 learners is ongoing. The hall is expected to address challenges associated with outdoor assemblies, worship services and large school events affected by weather conditions. Other significant infrastructure achievements is the construction of a storied laboratory block housing four classrooms and six modern laboratories. This development was driven by the demands of the Competency-Based Education system, which emphasizes practical, skills-based learning.

Learners Population Growth

Enrolment has grown steadily over the years. When Principal Ogol took over leadership in 2023, the school had 2,230 students. This number rose to 2,981 in 2024 before slightly reducing in 2025 due to changes in class streams. Currently, the school hosts 2,551 learners, a figure that remains higher than at the time of his transfer.

The sustained growth has necessitated proactive planning to ensure infrastructure development keeps pace with enrolment trends.

Strong Partnerships Driving Progress

Agoro Sare High School's transformation has been bolstered by strong partnerships with various stakeholders. The Constituency Development Fund has supported needy students, while several sponsors have stepped in to assist learners who join the school with



out basic necessities. The school's Old Boys' Association has played a particularly significant role. The association initiated the first phase of the multipurpose hall project,



contributing Ksh.10 million under the leadership of former Education Cabinet Secretary Ezekiel Machogu. The government later supported the second phase through capitation and maintenance funds, with plans underway for a third phase.

Digital Innovation and Smart School Management

Innovation has become a defining feature of school management at Agoro Sare High School. The institution was among the first to adopt the Zeraki digital school management system, earning Principal

Ogol national recognition as an early adopter. Zeraki has transformed academic analysis, administration and communication with parents. Teachers submit marks remotely, academic performance is analyzed in real time and parents receive instant updates on fees and learner progress.

Complementing Zeraki is the school's class wall communication system, which allows parents to receive daily updates on attendance, lesson delivery and classroom activities. This has enhanced transparency, accountability and collaboration between the school and families.





Sustained Academic Improvement

Academically, Agoro Sare High School has recorded consistent improvement. When Principal Ogol joined, the school posted a mean grade of 8.59 with an 89 percent transition rate to university. This improved to 9.17 with a 98 percent transition rate and later to 9.39 with a 99 percent transition rate.

In the most recent KCSE examinations, 597 out of 602 candidates attained a mean grade of C+ and above, qualifying for university admission. The remaining candidates achieved grades that allow progression through diploma pathways, which the school actively promotes as viable routes to higher education.

The number of quality grades has also risen significantly, with ten A grades and 101 A- grades recorded, compared to just one A grade in earlier years.

Curriculum Delivery and CBE Implementation

Curriculum delivery is closely supervised through a strong Directorate of Studies that ensures zero missed lessons and timely syllabus coverage. The school now clears



form four syllabi as early as February, allowing more time for revision and academic reinforcement. Agoro Sare National School is fully prepared for Grade 10 under the Competency-Base Education system, with capacity for 900 learners, 802 of whom have already been admitted. More than 80 percent of teachers have been retooled in CBE methodologies, and the school is equipped with Wi-Fi, smart screens and facilities for STEM, social sciences, arts and sports science.

Alumni Support, Talent and Community Collaboration

The school benefits from a strong alumni network that provides mentorship and inspiration to learners. Notable alumni include neurosurgeon Dr. Tom Odhiambo,

former Nairobi Governor Evans Kidero, Uriri Member of Parliament Mark Nyamita, former Education Cabinet Secretary Ezekiel Machogu and Akelo Misor of KUPPET. Talent development is highly valued, with some former students reportedly paying their school fees through income generated from their talents. The school also enjoys a strong relationship with the local community, from which about 30 percent of its students are drawn. Community members participate in tree planting activities, sports days and initiatives that connect needy learners with local leaders for support.
